Increase Access to Supports for Family Wellbeing

1. Increase the impact of the Family Resource Center Network

- Established statewide infrastructure for family support services
- Comprised of 35 non-profit agencies physically located in communities across Wisconsin
- Primary service delivery platform for the Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention Board
- Services proven to:
 - Strengthen all families
 - Produce academic gains for children
 - Reduce rates of child abuse in communities
 - Yield a high return on investment: ~ \$5 dollar return for every \$1 invested

2. Expand programming that supports children's mental health

- Triple P's: Positive Parenting Program & Positive Early Care and Education
 - o Best practice, evidence-based curriculum
 - o Proven to promote healthy child emotional and cognitive development
 - o Offered through Supporting Families Together Association Joint Network
- Healthy Minds Healthy Children
 - Social & Emotional trainings for early childhood providers and families
 - Wisconsin's statewide infant and early childhood mental health consultation program
 - o Offered through Wisconsin Alliance for Infant Mental Health

3. Bolster the Child Care Resource & Referral Network

- Federally-mandated state infrastructure established to support early care and education providers in Wisconsin
- Comprised of 9 non-profit agencies across the state, responsible for supporting providers in all 72 counties and 11 First Nations
- **Services for providers:** Recruitment, training, individualized assistance/coaching
- **Services for families:** Personalize assistance to connect with available child care options and other human services
- Services are critical to:
 - Expand, maintain the early care and education workforce supply
 - Ensure qualified early care and education providers
 - Maintain health and safety standards
