

FRCs at a Glance


- 87% of funding for WI FRCs is funded by local partners

Annual Budget of FRCs





FRC Funding Formula

Purpose: To support funders and FRC leaders plan a budget for a new FRC or expand current FRC services

Development: SFTA analysts tested multiple models to produce the most statistically accurate and concise formula

Note: Organizations should adapt the formula to include other local costs (number of families served, unique programs, etc.)



General Formula: $(s \times c) + a$

$$(s \times c) + a$$

where

S = staff

c = cost per staff

a = operations/overhead



Current Model:
$$(s \times \$67,273) + \$13,867$$



Example:

$$(5 \times \$67,273) + \$13,867 = \$350,232$$



Data Collection & Methods

Methods

<u>Participants & Sampling:</u> A total of 35 Family and Resource Centers located in Wisconsin were contacted for this analysis, 29 responded for a response rate of 82%.

<u>Data Collection Procedures</u>: An online survey was distributed to members using FormAssembly. Participants were not incentivized to complete the survey.

<u>Development of Funding Formula</u>: To develop a formula for FRC budgets, we looked at 3 variables: number of *Programs*, number of *Families Served*, and number of *Staff*, and a linear regression analysis was conducted. The purpose was to explore differences on FRC Budgets due to these organizational variables and create a formula for budget planning and development. The multi-variable linear regression showed that *Staff* (r square of 0.8186) had the strongest impact on FRC Budgets, compared to *Programs* and *Families* (r-square values of 0.2213 and 0.2491 respectively). The FRC funding formula is based on a linear function of funding per staff/position (r-squared = 0.8186).

<u>Limitations:</u> Analysis was limited due to sample size and use of opt-in sampling methods (FRCs were not randomly selected to participate).
