



THE TECHNOLOGY ACCESS PROGRAM

MAY-JUNE 2021

The Wisconsin Department of Children & Families contracted with SFTA in May 2021 to administer this short-term, Coronavirus Response & Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSA) funded program.

SFTA partnered with Kaplan Early Learning Company to offer eligible regulated Wisconsin child care programs the opportunity to order free technology devices and software to support business operations.





\$8,151,119

was expended in orders to provide free technology items to child care programs



3,846

child care programs placed orders (88% of eligible programs)



39,731

technology items were ordered by child care programs



TOTAL FUNDING: \$19,699,759




